



31.03.2016 – The UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Zeid Ra’ad Al Hussein has described the latest allegations of sexual abuse and exploitation in the Kemo prefecture of the Central African Republic as "sickening."

According to Zeid, major efforts were already underway to investigate allegations uncovered by a series of UN teams sent to the region over the past two weeks.

"The UN investigation into these sickening allegations, which suggest sexual abuse and exploitation of a large number of women and girls, must leave no stone unturned," Zeid said. "We are taking these allegations – some of which are particularly odious -- extremely seriously. It is vital that the victims are protected and receive all necessary care."
